We used EYPP funding for 2017-18 to continue the targeted provision of Forest School Sessions for specific children as an intervention strategy.

Children in EYPP cohort mainly live in flats</p> <p>Children will develop independence and the ability to work collaboratively. Children will increasingly use social communication and rich language. Children will be more confident and take risks, engaging in challenging physical experiences.</p> <p>Opportunities for children learn in an outdoor, woodland environment and develop socially, emotionally and physically through play and following their individual interests and motivations in a stimulating outdoor setting.</p> <p>Forest School activities promote development of self confidence, self belief, and provide opportunities to for children to play, socialise and talk in small groups with adult child ratio of 1:4.</p> <p>Session focus on promoting responsibility, respect for oneself, each other and the environment.</p>	<p>Tracking of progress on an individual as well as cohort level using data tracking system. Staff observations of the seven EYFS curriculum areas.</p> <p>These observations will be used to track where EYPP children are on entry to nursery and then termly.</p> <p>The resulting data will be evaluated to measure the impact of the provision.</p> <p>Parents will also be invited to provide feedback informally and on feedback forms.</p>	<p>Children will develop independence and the ability to work collaboratively.
