Ball the socks up, stand back and throw into the laundry basket. How many can you score?</p>
<p>Make your hands really soapy in the bath or in a bowl. Who can blow the biggest bubbles?</p>	<p>Use a lamp or a torch to create a light space on a wall. Can you use your hands to make different shadow puppets?</p>	<p>Bake some cakes or make your own sandwich for your lunch. How many pieces will you cut it into?</p>
<p>Make a picture or a collage to stick in your window. This will cheer people up as they do their daily exercise!</p>	<p>Listen to your favourite piece of music. Can everyone in your family make up a different dance move to this music? Put all these different moves together and have fun!</p>	<p>Make a map of your house/flat or room. Take it in turns to hide a favourite toy or 'treasure.' Can your family find it? Remember...x marks the spot!</p>
<p>Can you turn a piece of scrap paper into a paper aeroplane? How far and how high can it fly? How many jumps will it take you to reach it?</p>	<p>Use empty boxes and other things you may have at home, (eg lids, paper clips, elastic bands etc) to make a musical instrument. If everyone in the family makes one you have created a band! What songs and rhymes can you sing?</p>	<p>Play 'Kim's Game'. Put some objects onto a tray, (6-10 work well,) have a good look and try to remember them and then cover with a cloth. Take it in turns to hide one of the objects while your family closes their eyes. Who can guess the missing object?</p>
